Since July 2013, we have been working hard to ensure our organization's readiness for impactful and thriving future operations by filing necessary documentations with the local, state, government agencies accordingly. First, we filed for our 501c3, a federal document that will enable us to achieve our non-for-profit status with the Internal Revenue Service.

Secondly, the Board of Directors worked very diligently in defining and shaping the vision for future operations. At the same time, we were exploring ways to best focus our resources to make maximum impact in underdeveloped communities.

Partnerships

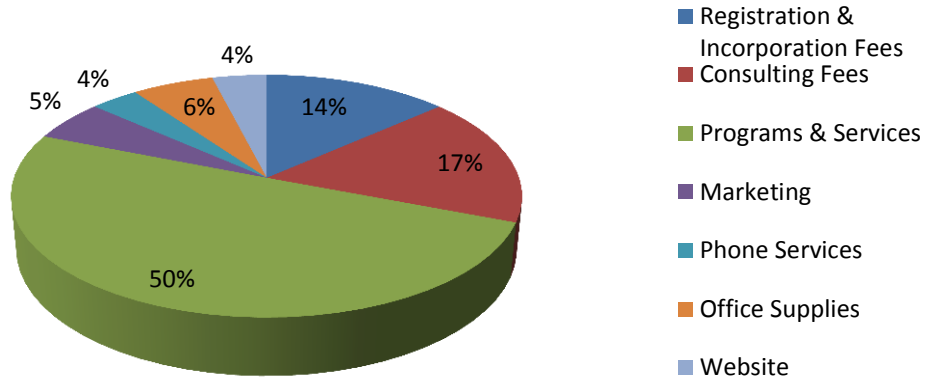
In October of 2013, we officially partnered with the Bamenda University of Science and Technology (BUST) in Bamenda, Cameroon, to launch the Global Citizenship Through Business and Education Program. Through the partnership, two selected BUST students would participate in the training design module, recruitment, and training of 15 market women as a part of their curriculum, under faculty supervision. This program is aimed at empowering women with the knowledge and skills to grow their businesses.
